NUCALA is a prescription medicine for add-on maintenance treatment of chronic rhinosinusitis with nasal polyps (CRSwNP) in adults whose disease is not controlled with nasal corticosteroids.

It's not you. It's biology. Having nasal polyps means there's inflammation in your nasal passages that can be caused by elevated levels of eosinophils—normal white blood cells in your body. Because surgery doesn't eliminate this inflammation, nasal polyps can grow back.

When your nasal polyp symptoms are all you can think about, it's time to ask your doctor about NUCALA—a non-surgical option.

Important Safety Information (cont'd)

NUCALA can cause serious side effects, including:

- **allergic (hypersensitivity) reactions, including anaphylaxis.** Serious allergic reactions can happen after you get your NUCALA injection. Allergic reactions can sometimes happen hours or days after you get a dose of NUCALA. Tell your healthcare provider or get emergency help right away if you have any of the following symptoms of an allergic reaction: swelling of your face, mouth, and tongue; breathing problems; fainting, dizziness, feeling lightheaded (low blood pressure); rash; hives.
- **herpes zoster infections** that can cause shingles have happened in people who received NUCALA.

Just know, it's important to monitor for serious allergic reactions after injection, either in your doctor's office or at home. Sometimes serious allergic reactions, including anaphylaxis, can occur hours or days after administration of NUCALA.

Important Safety Information (cont'd)

Before receiving NUCALA, tell your healthcare provider about all of your medical conditions, including if you:

- are taking oral or inhaled corticosteroid medicines. **Do not** stop taking your corticosteroid medicines, unless instructed by your healthcare provider because this may cause other symptoms to come back.
- have a parasitic (helminth) infection.
- are pregnant or plan to become pregnant. It is not known if NUCALA may harm your unborn baby.

Before receiving NUCALA, tell your healthcare provider about all of your medical conditions, including if you (cont'd):

- are breastfeeding or plan to breastfeed. You and your healthcare provider should decide if you will use NUCALA and breastfeed. You should not do both without talking with your healthcare provider first.
- are taking prescription and over-the-counter medicines, vitamins, and herbal supplements.

The most common side effects of NUCALA include: headache, injection site reactions (pain, redness, swelling, itching, or a burning feeling at the injection site), back pain, and tiredness (fatigue). Mouth/throat pain and joint pain have been reported with CRSwNP.
